PATIENT CARE TECHNICIAN PROGRAM

Explore our Patient Care Technician program!

With the increasing demand on the healthcare industry, patient care technicians are a vital part of today's medical workforce. These healthcare professionals provide direct patient care in hospitals, rehabilitation, or acute care facilities.



Under the supervision of doctors, nurses, and other medical professionals, a PCT is responsible for providing the following:

- Basic patient care like bathing, feeding, and catheter care
- Acquiring, distributing, and administering patient care supplies
- Ensuring the cleanliness of patient rooms and conducting safety checks o Monitoring and recording changes in patient health and vital signs
- Performing EKG and phlebotomy procedures o Collecting laboratory specimens

BEOC Enrollment to present at Brooklyn Justice Initiatives (BJI)

BEOC will be conducting a hybrid presentation to clients of Brooklyn Justice Initiatives. The session will be on-site and Zoom. Clients can attend in person at BEOC or via Zoom or in-person at 3 different BJI locations around the city.

After the session, BEOC staff will assist clients, who attend on-site, with their online application. BJI staff will assist clients, at their respective location, with the online application.

Brooklyn Justice Initiatives is staffed by a team of social workers, case managers, and court liaisons. By providing meaningful early diversion, pretrial supervised release, and post-conviction sentencing options, they seek to use an arrest as a window of opportunity to change the direction of an individual's life and avoid unnecessary incarceration.
